- Titolo e abstract:

Reciprocal Relationships and Gift-Giving: Research on a social institution with an attempt to understand the exchange between Glaukos and Diomedes in Hom. Il. 6, 119–236.

Starting with a brief look at the early research on gift-giving in anthropological studies, more recent approaches are discussed. They critically develop new ideas about the social institution of gift-giving which is too often conflated with the concept of reciprocity. In the ancient world, no literary texts show more gift-giving situations than the Homeric epics. An attempt will be made for a systematic overview of the different situations, the vocabulary used in these contexts, and the objects exchanged. In applying the actor-model as developed by Filippo Carlà and Maja Gori 2014, there will be a fresh look at the famous exchange between Glaukos and Diomedes.

Greek Ports on Promontories

Along the coasts of the Mediterranean Sea, promontories form the basic orientation for ancient sailors. They can be dangerous to the sailing ship or provide good anchorage. This paper will focus on the reassuring aspects and look at harbours lying on promontories for trying to understand whether and how ancient authors reflected this feature.

Exchange and Evaluation of Goods and Services: How to understand prices in ancient Athens?

Prices in antiquity are not the result of supply-demand-price-mechanisms, but they are as exchange processes part of a web of social interaction; social values determine the value of an object. The sources for the examination of price and wage information at Athens in the 5th and 4th centuries require a sensitivity to the difference between



representation and materiality. We can only interpret what the ancient authors thought about the conduct of people, how they judged behaviour, and what they believed about the world. In looking at different modes of evaluating objects in their respective contexts, first steps are made towards a kind of typology of ancient prices.

Sintetico *Curriculum vitae* Astrid Möller

Prof.ssa Astrid Möller teaches Greek and Roman history at Freiburg University. After receiving a Master of Studies in Classical Archaeology from Oxford University and her PhD in Ancient History from the Freie Universität Berlin, she worked as a postdoc at Freiburg University. She held fellowships at the Center of Hellenic Studies at Washington, DC, and at the Università degli Studi di Perugia and was invited to give a series of seminars at the EHESS Paris. Her research includes the social and economic history of Archaic and Classical Greece, Greek historiography, and methods of historiographical inquiry.
